- * We end the year with 143 members.
- * Curbside recycling IS coming to Pete! The People's Trash Coalition gained a unanimous City Council vote in February while 62 supporters packed City Council Chambers.
- * We facilitated 11 candidate forums attended by more than 700 constituents and registered 100 voters, during which 25 League members volunteered their time.
- * Our first web-based Voter Guide covered all 10 candidates in the November election.
- * Through our local Library Study, we updated our knowledge of the needs facing St. Pete's libraries and now have current information upon which to advocate.
- * By participating in the LWVF Charter School Study's consensus meeting, we increased our understanding of the issues on this very political topic and can now knowledgeably participate in LWVF Action Alerts during this legislative session.



Voter Service

We're on Track for Election Season Fall 2014! Want to Hop Aboard?

Session at which we assessed our goals and how best to achieve them in preparation for fall elections. The discussion centered around three initiatives: candidate forum training, targeted voter registration, and the production and distribution of voter guides.

During the meeting we acquired working group leaders for each of these initiatives who, with the help of other League volunteers, will work to carry out action plans. We also established a few of our next steps.

Amanda Patanow and I will coordinate our efforts to plan and facilitate a candidate forum training workshop, with a focus on moderator training, tentatively scheduled for June 14th. Next step: identify and recruit new moderator candidates.

Karen Knop, assisted by Diane Lohr, will take the reins to develop a plan for targeted voter registration. This includes identifying target rich venues and events at which to register voters and utilizing our resources effectively. Next steps: 1) meet with Pinellas County Supervisor of Elections, Deborah Clark, to learn how best to dovetail with her coverage and, 2) recruit and train volunteers to register voters.

Pat Wood and I will work with others in this group to produce the 2014 Voter Guide covering select county and statewide races as well as constitutional amendments and ballot issues like Greenlight

Pinellas. Next step: coordinate with the LWV of North Pinellas County to develop an action plan and attend a working group meeting set for May 1st.

There is much to do and something for everyone. If you or someone you know would be interested in becoming a League moderator or voter registrar--OR-- if you'd like to help with one or more of these initiatives, please contact me. Our success depends on volunteer participation, so join us and be a part of something big!

Progress for In-State College Tuition Rights

This week an in-state college tuition bill successfully passed its second review in the Florida Senate. My thanks to each of you who called or emailed members of the Senate Judiciary Committee. Your voice made a difference!

Next, this bill will go to the Senate Appropriations Committee before a floor vote. Undocumented students currently pay out-of-state tuition rate, which is four

times as expensive as in-state tuition rates. This bill proposes that students who meet the following criteria are eligible to pay in-state tuition, regardless of their and their parents' immigration status:

- *Attend Florida high schools for at least four years
- *Graduate from a Florida high school

Check your email for LWVF issued Action Alerts and PLEASE take action when you receive them. Meanwhile a similar in-state tuition bill has passed the Florida House.

The next Immigration Committee meeting will be on April 19th from 10:00 AM to 11:30 AM. Come join us and become informed on this complex issue.
