Work on DREAM Act Advocacy Continues Join us!



Federal Immigration & Customs Enforcement (ICE) arrests of the undocumented have expanded dramatically – especially in Georgia and Texas, where local law enforcement has been deputized to perform these federal duties.

In addition, the Trump administration has announced its intention to deport Haitians who are legally in the U.S. under Temporary Protective Status (TPS). This

status was granted after severe hurricanes hit the country, and it allows Haitians to work the U.S. and send part of their wages home to their relatives.

Currently 50,000 people are covered by this status. What would be the cost to locate and return these people? What would be the economic impact -- both to Haiti's and to ours? What is the rationale for removing them?

The LWVSPA Immigration Action Group recently sent you an educational piece about DREAMERs, which was followed by a request to take action and contact both of our U.S. Senators and your Representative, demanding action. **Read more...**


