- What is the general plan, including some comments on the structure, timeline, critical activities, and funds needed for the project?

Support a Ban on Single-Use Plastics

The St. Petersburg City Council will vote Dec. 13 on an ordinance to restrict the use of single-use plastics in the city. **We need you to show up and support the ordinance.** You can do so by:

- 1. Wear blue and make a public comment at the Dec. 13 City Council meeting at City Hall at 2:45 p.m. Email <u>Lisa Vanover</u> if you'd like help crafting your talking points.
- 2. Email City Council at <u>council@stpete.org</u>. Thank them for considering this ordinance, and state your support. We've provided <u>a template letter</u> to help you craft your email.
- 3. Help with outreach to businesses to get their support. Here are some talking points.

Sustainability

Gun Safety

We had a strong turn-out and great engagement at our October Gun Safety event, part of a 3-part voter education series co-sponsored by LWVSPA and the Unitarian Universalist Church of St. Petersburg. Speakers included representatives from Moms Demand Action, We the Students, and the South Side community. Rev. Carlos Senior, New Hope Missionary Baptist Church, was a particularly compelling speaker; we met with him recently for a follow-up conversation.

Four team members are preparing to meet with City Council Chair Lisa Wheeler-Bowman, Rev. Kenny Irby and representatives from the St. Petersburg Police Department to present <u>findings on the impact of firearms on domestic violence, suicide and violent crime</u> here in St. Petersburg and our findings and recommendations on <u>best community-based practices to prevent gun violence</u>. Given what we know about local impact, recent shootings and our research on programs that demonstrate evidence-based results, we believe it is time to take local action.

We are scheduling introductory meetings with local legislators for late January, focusing on LWV-FL gun safety legislative priorities.

Reproductive Rights & Justice

On Dec. 1, LWVSPA's Reproductive Rights Team partnered with Pinellas NOW and Progress Florida for a visibility event outside one of Pinellas County's dozen anti-abortion, fake women's health/wellness centers.

Dressed in "Handmaid's Tale" uniforms, the group drew attention to the sexism and anti-women rhetoric promoted by these extremist organizations, which receive millions of



Florida taxpayer dollars annually. With reproductive rights more vulnerable than ever, things are beginning to mirror the dystopian society depicted in the novel/TV show. For more information about these clinics, watch this short video.

Immigration

Immigration remains of keen interest across this nation, and there is energy in the newly elected House of Representatives for some immigration legislation. The most favorable would be to pass legislation that gives DREAMers a path to citizenship. Over 70% of adults support such legislation.

To support that effort, our Action Group will shine a light on local DREAMers and encourage communication with our elected federal officials. We also plan to exchange information and plans with other immigration groups within the FL League and LWVUS. The local League in Augusta, Georgia, used our "Before You Vote: Some Immigration Facts" info cards at a Voter Services session just before the election. We can learn so much from each other.

Education

At Nov. 30 Education Advocacy Committee meeting, co-chairs Robin Jones and Iris Yetter resigned. Robin now would like to chair the new Advocacy Research Subcommittee. We Leaguers need to learn the point of view of education-committee legislators, monitor their meetings, follow their bills, and be proactive during session before their bills become laws. Iris proposes chairing the new Community Education Subcommittee. It will create and distribute a matrix comparing traditional public vs. charter schools on these critical issues: administration, management, accountability, safety, student performance and student dismissal, etc. These should be transparent to families considering school choice, also to taxpayers before legislators allocate tax dollars to K-12 education. National Popular Vote

There will be several opportunities to learn more about the **National Popular Vote**, which uses the existing Electoral College system to elect the president and vice president by counting the total votes nationally. Team members will give a presentation Jan. 18 in Orlando prior to the start of the State Leadership Conference. The Hillsborough League has a workshop planned for Feb. 20 and the LWVSPA is working to host a workshop in late January.
