LWVSPA members traveled to Tallahassee for the League of Women Voters of Florida's annual Lobby Days on January 23 and 24. Lots of advocacy training, networking, and advocating happened in the State Capitol, capped off by a press conference in the Capitol rotunda, with the theme "Our Voices, Our History, Our Future". In addition to urging legislators to prioritize voting rights and election reform, Leaguers lobbied on our three current priority areas: reproductive health, education, and gun violence prevention.

**Reproductive Rights Team Update** 



The Floridians Protecting Freedom (FPF) campaign who are leading efforts to put abortion rights on the 2024 ballot received official notice on January 26th from the Florida Secretary of State. The amendment to limit government interference is official. We got our number!

Now, all eyes are on the Supreme Court of Florida to let us vote Yes on 4 in '24! Oral arguments will take place on February 7. FPF is hosting a watch party by Zoom, with LWVSPA's own Amy Weintraub hosting and two ACLU attorneys providing commentary.




