WHAT is your favorite experience with the LWVSPA?

My favorite moments are when you get to mix friendship, mentorship, and advocacy together in different League activities. I love the collaborative, supportive nature of the League -- it makes me feel like we can do anything and that we all support each other.

WHERE do you find inspiration within the LWVSPA?

It is so important to have an informed electorate that also feel empowered to become and remain active as participants in their government. We are fighting apathy and disenfranchisement fueled by misinformation, lack of access



to factual information, and legislation that prevents people from being able to access their government through voter suppression, weakened consumer and citizen protection institutions, and campaign financing by special interests and big money donors.

WHY did you join the LWVSPA?

I was looking for an organization that was well-respected, used research to make decisions, and focused on civic engagement. When I joined, I was so happy to be around other passionate people that wanted to change our community for the better. I've been in love ever since.



HOW are you involved with LWVSPA?

I dove right in very quickly! I started with the Reproductive Rights action team and now co-lead an initiative in that group to advocate for comprehensive sex education in Pinellas County. I am also a board director and provide grant writing and project leadership for the local League. This year, I have helped secure \$140,000 for civic engagement, voter education, and advocacy projects.

WHEN not with the LWVSPA?

I love rock climbing, free diving, and enjoying the treasures of St. Petersburg. I also co-host a public health podcast called Viral!

What's Happening Around LWVSPA?

Gun Safety

As of Feb. 3, close to 20 firearm-related bills have been introduced for the 2019 FL Legislative Session. Legislation to ban assault weapons and high capacity magazines (SB466, SB500 and HB455) and tighten licensing requirements (SB654, SB468 and HB135) have been introduced in both houses.



The majority of the Senate bills are "smart" legislation, including what appears to be an attempt

to modify Stand Your Ground, making the burden of proof on the defendant more stringent (SB636). Most of the House bills take an ardent gun rights position: HB175 essentially guts last year's Marjorie Stoneman Douglas Act and HB6007 would permit campus and open carry.

In late January, our team had productive meetings with Rep. Ben Diamond, Rep. Jennifer Webb & Sen. Darryl Rouson to advocate for <u>LWV-FL's five gun safety</u> legislative priorities.

Thanks to team member Kathy Phelan, we're tracking <u>all firearm-related bills</u> on our site, and we're updating it bi-weekly through the end of session in May. To learn more about the issues and how to take action, visit <u>lwvspa.org/gun-issues</u>.

Education

The Education Action Group is preparing for 2019, as they anticipate the goals of Amendment 8 - removing local control in public education and dramatically expanding charter schools and tax-credit scholarships - will resurface this year. They are also monitoring the possibility that "school safety" (particularly legislation related to arming teachers) could be another dominant legislative issue. **Read more** about the action group's activities in December.

Reproductive Justice

The Reproductive Rights Action Group is partnering with Pinellas NOW and Planned Parenthood for a screening of "Birthright: A War Story," which is a feature-length documentary that exposts of the truth of how American women are being jailed, physically violated and even put at risk of dying as a radical movement tightens its group across America and allows states, courts and religious doctrine to govern weather, when and how women will bear children. A discussion will be held afterwards.

The screening will be held Feb. 23 at 1:30 p.m. in the Auditorium of the St. Petersburg Main Library.
