Letter from the President



Dear Leaguers,

Happy African American History Month and 101st Founding Day for the League of Women Voters (February 14)!

Just like our democracy, we've experienced extreme stressors over the past year and the past month. To witness an insurrection on our Capitol was a surreal experience that produced feelings of anger, sadness, fear, and frustration.

This prompted a historic decision by our <u>National</u> <u>League to actively call for the removal and impeachment of former</u> <u>President Donald Trump</u>. Standing for democracy and calling for elected officials to be held accountable when engaging in acts of sedition is, and will always be, a nonpartisan stance.

We have a long road ahead of us. A nonviolent Inauguration reminded us that the peaceful transfer of power is a keystone of our democracy. There are still threats to democracy we must face as we advocate for free and fair elections, fight voter suppression tactics, and empower voters in our community to be actively engaged. I don't doubt that our League is up to the task; we have an active Legislative Session ahead of us here in Florida with our own Program Planning and Annual Meeting right around the corner.

I hope you find time to reflect and recharge; so much of the work we do can lead to burnout and compassion fatigue. We can't pour water from an empty well; let's take care of each other so we can keep working for our community and for voters.

PROGRAM PLANNING IN PROGRESS!

Every year, our local League solicits advocacy and educational issues from our membership to set our *Program*, or priorities, for the next League year (May to April). This process happens during Program Planning, an event where advocacy and education teams present their issue, its importance to the League, and their plan for the next year. Members then vote on each issue to be presented at our Annual Meeting in April as our Program for the new League year. This year, to keep our members safe, we are doing things a little differently. We have sent out a template for members and current team leads to fill out if they have an advocacy and/or education issue they would like to see in our Program. These documents will then be used to create a Program Planning Workbook for our membership to review ahead of the **Program Planning meeting on February 18th**, **2021**.

A survey will also be sent out ahead of the Program Planning meeting for members to ask questions of each team. Answers to these questions and short presentations will be given at the Program Planning meeting; the meeting will culminate in a vote to add (or not to add) each issue to next year's Program at the Annual Meeting.

THE VOTER GUIDE TO MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS

The March 9 municipal elections are almost upon us. (Yes, we're all still recovering from November, but democracy rests for no one!)

Voters in <u>**10 cities and towns</u>** will head to the polls to vote for mayors, city</u>

commissioners and city council members, as well as several charter amendments. These smaller elections draw less attention than larger ones, which means our **<u>Pinellas County Voter Guide</u>** is one of the few chances voters have to hear directly from the candidates themselves and to learn more about what's on their ballots.

The Voter Guide includes everything you ever wanted to know about voting in Pinellas County, including how to make sure your vote-by-mail ballot counts and what you should do if you're offered a provisional ballot.

IMPORTANT: We're in the process of transitioning our online Voter Guide to **Vote411.org**, so the Voter Guide will function a little differently than it has in years past. You'll still be able to view it using your mobile devices, and now you'll also be able to look up what's on your ballot by simply entering your address. We appreciate your patience with us as we make this transition!

KEY DEADLINES FOR MARCH MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS

If you're planning to vote in this election, here are some key dates you should be aware of:

- Feb. 2: Candidate forums for Kenneth City and Redington Beach
- Feb. 2: Mail ballots start going out to domestic voters
- Feb. 8: Voter registration deadline
- Feb. 27: Last day to request a ballot be mailed (you can still pick one up)



The Food Politics Team is co-chaired by Jen Underhill and Julie Kessel. The eight-member team includes an educator, an organic farmer, a registered dietician, a marine biologist, an engineer, a chef, a physician & policy consultant, and a public health information specialist. Together they form a dynamic team that is making an impact, enjoying food and fun along the way.

The League's mission is to Defend Democracy and Empower Voters. For The Food Politics Team, that means empowering people to make better food choices for their individual health and the environment, exposing the corrupting influence of corporate money on our food and health systems, and advocating for more equitable food access and public policy in St. Petersburg.

In the face of the pandemic, the team launched a new online event series called Digital Dining. During the 2020/21 program year, the team hosted five Digital Dining events, featuring subject matter experts and elected and non-elected public officials. More than 100 people attended and four partner organizations were engaged in the series.

The Food Politics Team played a key role in establishing the city's new Food Policy Council and supports the urban agricultural policy movement in St. Petersburg. As a founding member of the council, The Food Politics Team is excited about the opportunity to advocate for policy that address nutrition insecurity and equity in food access. The Food Politics Team's role on the council will be to facilitate citizen input.

Jen Underhill says, "Individually all of us can improve our own health and the health of the planet by making different food choices.

Only collectively, however, can we combat the undue influence of big money in politics.

Helping people to understand how food shapes their destiny and empowering them to make healthier decisions regarding food is a critical cog in the wheel of an engaged citizenry, and helps to reduce health and economic disparity and create a more participatory democracy." Amy Weintraub was there!

"This was my sixth year attending the downtown St. Pete visibility event, and I know it's more important than ever to keep standing up. With new anti-abortion majorities now on the U.S. Supreme Court and on the Florida State Supreme Court, access to abortion is threatened like never before.

The first year I moved to Florida, Sue Price, an old friend from Charleston, WV who'd moved to St. Pete a few years before, suggested we should attend the Roe visibility event together. I look at photos from that 2016 event and see women with whom I've become great friends and co-conspirators in the Florida reproductive rights movement. At Sue's urging, I joined the St. Pete League soon after and later went on to chair LWVF's statewide Reproductive Health & Justice Action Team."



Carol Marks was there!

"I participate in this event each year in support of Roe v. Wade and those who made it happen in 1973. Coming of age in the 70's and 80's, this law made it possible for me and my friends to make our own health care decisions and chart our own lives. I acknowledge and stand with the women who sacrificed so much before that time. I will continue to show up and, as the sign says: "Never Backing Down" or giving up the rights for women to be in control of our own medical care."
