Local elections supervisors have made it official: As of Jan. 8, <u>all eligible former felons will be allowed to</u> register to vote.

We'll be joining several other organizations at a press conference organized by Rep. Charlie Crist's office at 8:30 a.m on Jan. 8 on the steps of City Hall. Afterwards the group will walk across 5th Avenue to the Supervisor

of Elections office to help returning citizens get registered to vote. The Voter Services committee will be holding an additional voter registration drive later that day as well.

Human rights violations continue to take place at our southern border. To get the real facts about the birthright citizenship, the border wall with Mexico and refugees, check out Immigration Fact sheets at Iwvspa.org/immigration.

The Education Action Group is preparing for 2019, as they anticipate the goals of Amendment 8 - removing local control in public education and dramatically expanding charter schools and tax-credit scholarships - will resurface this year. Reproductive Justice

The Reproductive Rights Action Group will be taking part in a Roe v. Wade Anniversary Visibility event on Jan. 22 at 12 p.m. at 277 Central Ave. in St. Petersburg.

They are also partnering with Pinellas NOW and Planned Parenthood for a screening of "Birthright: A War Story," which is a feature-length documentary that exposts of the truth of how American women are being jailed, physically violated and even put at risk of dying as a radical movement tightens its group across America and allows states, courts and religious doctrine to govern weather, when and how women will bear children. A discussion will be held afterwards.

The screening will be held Feb. 23 in the Auditorium of the St. Petersburg Main Library. More information about the time will be released once it's confirmed.
