Happening Next Month: The St. Petersburg Primary Election



The St. Petersburg Primary Election is happening Aug. 27. Voters in Districts 1, 3, 5 & 7 will have the chance to vote for candidates in those races. Since this is a primary, the top two vote-getters in each district will then go on the ballot for the General Election on Nov. 5.

Our mobile-friendly Voter Guide will include responses from all of the candidates on the issues that matter most to St. Petersburg's voters. **Sign up here** to get

notified by email when the election guide launches. The Voter Guide also contains a wealth of knowledge about voting in Pinellas County, so make sure to check it out at pinellasvoterguide.com.

The candidates will also be taking part in a **candidate forum to be held July 23 at 6:30 p.m.** at the Sunshine Center. The audience will have the chance to hear directly from all of the city council candidates, so make sure to attend so you can make an informed decision when casting your ballot.

Attention college students! The voter registration deadline for this election is coming up July 29, which means you only have a few more weeks to make a plan for voting in the primary election. Make sure you know where you are registered and what you need to do to make sure you're able to vote.

Something for you to think about: Even if you consider another city to be your home base, you may want to consider registering to vote in the community where you attend college. By participating in local elections, you have the opportunity to exercise some influence in your community - even if you only live there during your college years.

Gun Safety


The team's newly-formed gun safety coalition, supported by the Foundation for a Healthy St. Pete, will survey St. Petersburg residents over the next six months to better understand the impact of gun violence in our neighborhoods. An analysis of that information will help us identify and hopefully implement programs that will be most effective in preventing gun violence here in St. Petersburg.

The team recommends reading **this analysis** of the monetary cost of gun violence in Detroit, as well as **this report** about the study, conducted by the nonprofit Force Detroit.

Immigration

On July 3, team members joined a coalition of local organizations deeply concerned about the treatment of migrants - in particular, the 2,600 children detained at the for-profit facility in Homestead - who met with Rep. Charlie Crist's Staff Director, Steven Cary.





We also asked that the House Appropriations Committee conduct hearings regarding the fiscal oversight of the various no-bid contracts, the hiring practices of the vendors and the treatment of the detainees. A follow-up meeting is scheduled for July 24.
