Women Make Democracy Work!

What better way to celebrate International Women's Day than by learning how to advocate for the causes you believe in?

Join us on March 8 for a hands-on advocacy training, where you'll learn the following:

- the up-to-date facts on the Florida Constitution Review Commission (CRC) and the issues that are at stake;
- more about the <u>"Terrible 10" proposed</u> <u>constitutional amendments</u> and what they mean for Floridians if passed;



- how to prepare to testify for the CRC's public hearing in St. Petersburg on March 13;
- how to craft a 90-120 second speech, a persuasive email or a letter to the editor.

Plus you'll have the opportunity to receive feedback from seasoned advocates on the issues you're most passionate about.

The workshop is led by the League of Women Voters of the St. Petersburg Area and co-sponsored by Fired Up Pinellas. **Everyone is invited to attend, but** <u>please</u> <u>register ahead of time.</u> Refreshments will be provided.

The event will be held from 6:15 to 8:45 at Allendale United Methodist Church, located at 3803 Haines Road in St. Petersburg.

If you can't attend the March 8 training but you still want to hone your skills as an advocate, mark your calendars for March 29, when we'll hold another training - this one focused on gun safety and net neutrality.

We'll have the latest on what legislation passed, and what didn't pass. It should be no surprise that areas of focus for our legislators were guns, education, preemption, and voting.

We'll also launch our net neutrality initiative – what is it, why it matters, and what we're going to do about it. The advocacy workshop portion of our event will focus on arming you with facts and talking points, role=playing how to communicate your message to our local legislators, and more.

Speak Out About the Future of the Florida Constitution

The Constitution Revision Commission will be holding a public hearing on March 13 at USF St. Petersburg - and this is YOUR chance to make your voice heard on the <u>"Terrible 10" proposed</u> <u>constitution amendments</u> and a proposed assault rifle ban.



PLEASE NOTE: If you'd like to speak on behalf of the League, you MUST do one of the following:

- Attend the March 8 advocacy training at Allendale United Methodist Church (this is preferred);
- Speak with LWVSPA President Julie Kessel ahead of time;
- Sign up on the day of the hearing at a table that will be staffed by Amy Weintraub in the lobby of the USFSP University Student Center.

If you speak on behalf of the League, you must use the League talking points. You also have the option to speak on your own behalf.

You will have two minutes to speak during the public hearing, and you will only be allowed to speak once. You do not need to attend the entire event, but you should expect to stand in line before you will be able to speak in front of the CRC.

Short Documentary Shows How St. Petersburg Defends Our Democracy



Last October, St. Petersburg became the first municipality in the country to ban super PACS and prohibit foreign investment in our local elections. On Jan. 1, that ordinance became law.

What's Happening Around the LWVSPA?

Education

Over 170 parents, teachers and citizens gathered on Feb. 27 at Allendale United Methodist Church to watch "Backpack Full of Cash," a feature-length documentary on

the privatization of public schools and the resulting impact on America's most vulnerable children.

The LWVSPA Education Committee will spend the coming months informing the parents and taxpayers of Pinellas County about the effects of charter schools and taxcredit vouchers on our district. With <u>HB 7055</u>, the Florida Legislature is proving that we have a battle on our hands. <u>Read more...</u>

Gun Safety

Over 100 participants attended our panel, entitled "Preventing Gun Violence: A Community Conversation," on Feb. 13. Led by moderator Ryan Mitchell, the panelists -St. Petersburg City Council Chair Lisa Wheeler-Bowman, pediatrician Dr. David Berman, and licensed psychologist Dr. Amanda Raitano - shared their perspectives on gun violence and actions the community can take.

Key recommendations included the need to address the root cause and look at the role of poverty and race; the need for families to take an active role in monitoring children's mental health and be good role models; the need to keep guns locked, store ammo separately, and lock cars with locked guns; the need to humanize victims in order to most effectively tell the story; and the need for each of us to get involved. **Read more...**

Immigration

Our focus is in two areas: passage of the DREAM Act and monitoring local impact of the Trump administration's increased emphasis on the detention and deportation of law abiding undocumented immigrants.

We continue to partner with the DREAMer-founded #ClearwaterHereToStay, helping them arrange for an immigration lawyer for their educational panel held on Feb. 26 and providing a table for so attendees could write postcards to U.S. senators, asking them to vote for a DREAM Act. **Read more...**
