Creating a Rain Garden: A Project of the LWVSPA Sustainability Team

Rain gardens are shallow, constructed depressions that are planted with deep-rooted native plants and grasses. Rain gardens slow the flow of rainwater from roofs, sidewalks, streets, parking lots, and other impervious surfaces, allowing the water to penetrate the soil. The soil cleans the water of pollutants before it enters the storm drain and empties into our bayous and bays.

Laura Crabtree and her team applied for and won a mini-grant from Tampa Bay Estuary Program to create a "Demonstration Rain Garden" at Sanderlin Neighborhood Family Center. One hundred ninety



native plants, 40 bales of pine straw, and 1300 lbs of rock were installed. Plant identifier signs and interpretive signage will be installed to educate school kids and the community about the importance of native habitat and how it provides cleaner ground and surface water.

Twenty-eight volunteers showed up on Saturday April 9th, 2022 to create the garden. About half the volunteers were League members, the others were non-League members. Jan, David, Deb and Dan from the Florida Native Plant Society were there to assist League members Gretchen Johnson, Rita Knorr, Laura Crabtree and Elizabeth Nail with the planting.
