Election 2018 Is A Wrap... Sort Of

As you're probably aware, the 2018 General Election took place this past Tuesday, and voters all over the country were highly motivated to head to the polls. Pinellas County was no different, with nearly 66% of the county's registered voters casting a ballot. The last time the **county's voter turnout** for a midterm election was that high was in 1994.



Many thanks to all of our League members who worked tirelessly this election season, whether it was by educating voters about the constitutional amendments, registering

new voters and getting seasoned voters to update their signatures, working on the Voter Guide, volunteering at candidate forums, serving as poll monitors, and so much more. Our work has not gone unnoticed; many League members report hearing from friends, colleagues and other community members, who tell them our efforts helped them feel more informed and empowered when it came time to vote.

Our work isn't over yet - with the governor, senator and agricultural commission races heading to automatic recounts, League volunteers have already been offering their services as canvassing board observers. The League of Women Voters of Florida has also issued a statement regarding the elections situation. We worked hard to motivate our fellow Floridians to exercise their right to vote; now it's time to ensure all of those votes are counted fairly and accurately.



Gulfport Votes 100%... Almost



Midterm elections usually don't attract as much participation than presidential elections, but in the small beach town of Gulfport, 71.5% of the 10,662 registered voters cast ballots in the 2018 midterm elections. This was a substantial increase from 63% in the 2014 midterms and more than the Florida average of 62% turnout.

While voter participation was up all over the country this year, at least some of this improvement could be credited to a project called **Gulfport Votes 100%**.

Gulfport Votes 100% was designed to counteract the apathy and confusion by encouraging civic engagement with an audacious goal of 100% participation and people-to-people outreach activities. When the goal is 100%, then every vote counts. **Read more...**
