

Municipal Elections: They're Almost Here. Are You Ready?

We're down to the last days before the Nov. 5 municipal election! Make sure you're ready to cast an informed vote by checking out our voter guide at PinellasVoterGuide.com. Make sure to share it with your friends and family who will be voting in this election!



If you've already submitted your vote-by-mail ballot, then good job! But if you haven't yet, make sure to take these steps:

- SIGN YOUR ENVELOPE.
- Use black ink to fill in the bubbles.
- Fill in the bubbles; don't use a check mark, circle the candidate's name or underline anything.

These were the most common voter errors as reported by Deputy Supervisor of Elections Julie Marcus, so make sure to take these steps when filling out your ballot, and make sure your friends and family do as well!

And if you're heading out to the polls on Tuesday, make sure to read this list of 6

things every Pinellas County voter should know. You may also see one of our friendly poll monitors out there at your polling place (identified by t-shirts and lanyards), so say hi when you see them!




Plant Power: Tampa Bay Veg Fest Field Trip & "Forks Over Knives" Screening

Gun Safety

The Gun Safety Action Team is tracking firearm-related bills introduced for the 2020 FL Legislative session. To date, 15 bills have been introduced in the Senate, all of which we consider to be "smart" gun safety legislation; 12 bills have been introduced in the House, less than half are "smart" legislation.

We're throwing our most enthusiastic support behind an expansion of Risk Protection Orders (SB114 & HB47), strengthening of background checks and transfer of firearms through licensed dealers (SB94, SB270, SB460, SB548 & HB289) and safe storage of

loaded firearms (SB266).

Thanks to the diligent work of team member Kathy Phelan, we'll update this page regularly and report on significant action through the end of session next spring.

Immigration

The Immigration Action Team sends its thanks to everyone who wrote postcards to Rep. Charlie Crist and Sens. Marco Rubio and Rick Scott asking them to conduct oversight hearing about the child immigrant detention center in Homestead, Florida.



Those hearings first focused on the treatment of the children housed there, as well as the long term emotional impacts to them. By mid-August, those children were moved to smaller non-profit facilities or were reunited with a family member. Though no longer housing children, the Office of Refugee Resettlement still paid \$600 per "empty" bed.

Many groups - including our League - and the media raised concerns to our elected officials in Congress. On Oct. 28, it was announced the facility would be permanently closed.

Thank you — working together, we do make a difference.

In other NPVIC news, Rep. Joseph Geller has filed HB335 (Agreement Among the States to Elect the President by National Popular Vote) for the 2020 legislative session. Sen. Victor Torres will file a companion bill shortly. The two legislators are sponsoring a Learning at Lunch event at the State House in Tallahassee for Nov. 12. All legislators have been invited to hear Dr. Vikram Amar, dean of the University of Illinois Law School, speak on the law's constitutionality and fair voting attributes.
