LWVFL 2022 LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES



As a result of receiving legislative priority ballot choices from LWVSPA and 27 other local Leagues (29 total), we have a very clear understanding of what our state members think the priorities should be. **See state priorities.**

Approximately 3,000 bills will be introduced between now and January 11. Out of those, about 300 will become law. The League is

currently monitoring approximately 80+ bills.

At the April 2022 LWVSPA Annual Meeting, members will decide which specific issues our members will champion in the upcoming year. **See 2021 LWVSPA Annual Meeting and Priorities**
