"Winnie Foster: The Activist
Pollinator." Winnie is a long-time member of the League of Women Voters
St. Petersburg whose contagious energy and tenacity feeds the spirit for civil rights.

This documentary, the first of twelve episodes about Saint Petersburg's leaders, depicts Winnie's courage and willingness to work with bulwarks of integration and the women's rights movement forever altered the political and socioeconomic landscape in Southern Pinellas County.

The series profiles citizens who have left an indelible footprint in the advancement of equal rights, education, and the arts.

The documentaries are scheduled to be released over the next year.

Oct 25: The League Talks Gun Safety and Charter Schools

Two League leaders will take the stage at an upcoming community event:

The League of Women Voters Florida's First Vice President and Chair of the Florida Gun Safety Committee, **Patti Brigham**, will discuss gun safety issues, advocacy, and legislative goals.



Our own **Robin Jones**, Co-Chair of our League's Education Action Group, will then discuss charter schools. Charter schools began in the 1990's as laboratories of innovation within the public education system, supported by teachers and education professionals. Today charter schools have become highly controversial, promoted more as competitors of rather than compliments to public schools and often built and managed by national for-profit charter chains. Last

spring the Florida legislature continued its quest to make Florida one of the most charter friendly states in the country with it omnibus HB 7069. As parents and taxpayers we need to understand charters and their proper role in our public education system.

Call to Action

We Need Your Help: Florida Voting Rights Restoration for Felons Initiative

Together, let's say yes to second chances and redemption so all Floridians can be full members of their communities.

The proposed ballot summary is as follows:

This amendment restores the voting rights of Floridians with felony convictions after they complete all terms of their sentence including parole or probation.

The amendment would not apply to those convicted of murder or sexual offenses, who would continue to be permanently barred from voting unless the Governor and Cabinet vote to restore their voting rights on a case by case basis.

They've paid their debt to society. It is time to restore these people's right to vote.

In order to get this Voting Restoration Amendment onto the 2018 ballot, 700,000 petitions from Florida voters need to be collected by December, 2017.

We are asking each LWVSPA member to collect 10 signed petitions by December 2017. Contact <u>Stephanie Owens</u> or the <u>League office</u> to arrange to submit your petition.
