Empowerment Grant Will Help Us Promote Civic Engagement

We're extremely excited and proud to announce that we've received one of eight Empowerment Grants from the Foundation for a Healthy St. Petersburg!

The \$100,000 grant will be used to create a St. Petersburg Civic Health Index Report, which will measure civic engagement and volunteerism in St. Petersburg, and to work with the community to increase civic engagement.



As part of the grant, we'll be conducting educational programs like Democracy 101, which links constitutional principles with current issues, and Runaway Inequality, which educates voters about income inequality and how it runs as a common thread through the issues we care about. We're also partnering with local community groups to better understand how we can all work together to increase civic engagement in our city.

Many thanks to LWVSPA's President Julie Kessel, Vice President Lisa Vanover and Director Linsey Grove for their efforts in securing this grant. It will go a long way toward helping us achieve our goals of getting more people actively involved with the community and our political system.



Get Educated: Runaway Inequality & Voter Education Series

We're holding a **Runaway Inequality training** on Sept. 14, which will look at the issue of economic inequality and the impact this has on every social issue we care about. The training will explain how we got where we are, and it will give you the tools to talk about income inequality and to describe how it touches every part of our society.

The training will be held Friday, Sept. 14 from 6-9 p.m. at Allendale United Methodist Church, located at 3803 Haines Road in St. Petersburg.

We're also helping to put on a three-part voter education series in October. The series will be hosted at the Unitarian Universalist Church in St. Petersburg and will cover the following topics:

- Oct. 2: Affordable housing, restorative justice and education
- Oct. 16: Gun safety
- Oct. 25: Proposed constitutional amendments




Learn How to Use Social Media for Good


Gun Safety

Members of Gun Safety Action Team canvassed St. Petersburg's neighborhoods throughout the summer part of the City's **Not My Son initiative**. Members also met with state Rep. Ben Diamond and state Sen. Darryl Rouson to discuss legislative priorities, and they're continuing to conduct research and produce fact sheets and reading lists related to gun safety. They expect to have those materials posted on **the website** by the end of September.

Immigration

The Immigration Action Team is trying to obtain information about immigrants held for Immigrations and Customs Enforcement by the Pinellas County Sheriff's Office.

they're working with local college students on projects related to the Dreamers.
